Krzysztof Zimowski violin

Krzysztof Zimowski was born in Wroclaw, Poland and began his musical studies as a six-year-old. An orchestral musician since the 1970s, he has performed throughout Europe, Mexico and South America and in numerous competitions. In 1977 in Warsaw, in the only National Competition of music of Karol Szymanowski, he won third prize. In 1986 he moved to the US and formed the Helios String Quartet and has performed with the Phoenix Symphony, Santa Fe Opera, Santa Fe Symphony and Santa Fe Pro Musica. Each summer since 1994, Mr. Zimowski has performed with the Grant Park Symphony Orchestra in the renowned International Music Festival in Millennium Park in Chicago. He is currently Concertmaster of the New Mexico Philharmonic and Opera Southwest.

Jacquelyn Helin piano

Steinway Artist Jacquelyn Helin consistently wins acclaim for her vibrant and musical playing of a wideranging repertoire and has performed in recital and with orchestras in the major musical capitals of Europe and the United States. As winner of the Artists International Piano Competition, Ms. Helin made her New York debut in Carnegie Recital Hall; she made her European debut in London's Wigmore Hall. Ms. Helin has played most important music venues in New York and Washington DC and was a WESTAF touring artist. Locally, she has performed chamber music with such groups as Santa Fe New Music, the Santa Fe Chamber Music Festival, the Santa Fe Opera, the Taos Chamber Music Group, and Ballet ProMusica. She maintains a large private studio in Santa Fe and teaches at the New Mexico School for the Arts; and many of her students regularly win top prizes in competitions. She has recorded for New World and Musical Heritage.
